Who is Caring Carroll?

Caring Carroll is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization, established in 2007, that provides volunteers to help older adult residents of Carroll County, who have limited financial and social resources.



Who are the Volunteers?

Volunteers are trained and background checked.

Who are the Care Receivers?

Care Receivers are Carroll County residents, 60 years plus, with little or no local support, who are living independently and need some assistance with everyday tasks.

All Care Receivers need to be interviewed and registered prior to receiving services.

Financial assistance may be available.

What kind of care is provided?

Caring Carroll volunteers provide non-medical services such as:

- ◆ Friendly Visits
- ◆ Local Transportation within Carroll County
- ◆ Shopping/Errands
- ◆ Monthly Social Phone Calls
- ◆ Limited Non-emergency medical transportation to Frederick, Howard and Baltimore counties and Baltimore city
